Portland Jewish Book Month: One Book, One Community

Join us for the first Portland Jewish Book Month. We will discuss *By Fire, By Water* by Mitchell James Kaplan as part of the first city-wide celebration of Jewish books. This award-winning historical novel tells the story of Luis de Santangel, the chancellor to the king of Aragon and a converso (a Jewish convert to Christianity) at a time when the Inquisition sought to repress Jews in 15th-century Spain. Santangel was a friend and financier of Christopher Columbus. He becomes curious about his Jewish heritage and becomes attracted to Judith Migdal, a beautiful Jewish woman, as the Inquisition closes in. This discussion is cosponsored by Congregation Neveh Shalom and Multnomah County Library. Various other events for Portland Jewish Book Month will be sponsored around the city by six congregations and the Oregon Jewish Museum in November.
