Getting Started

- Go to the Multnomah County Library's home page: www.multcolib.org
- Click on **Homework Center**
- Click on **The Oregonian and Other Newspapers.**
- Type in your library barcode number (the whole number--without any spaces) and PIN.
- Select "Oregon." Select "The Oregonian."
- You are now at the main search screen:

- Type your search term(s) and hit the Enter key or click on the **Search** button.
Note that you can type a phrase in quotation marks.
You can also limit by dates, or choose to browse current issues of the newspaper instead of searching.
- A list of articles will appear. To read an article, click on its title.
