

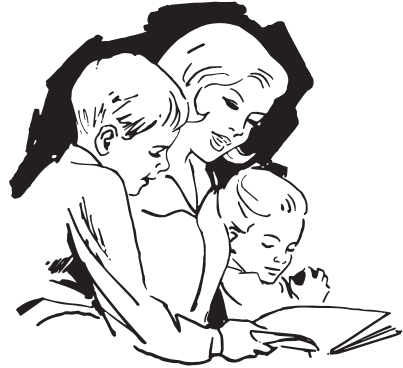


## School Corps

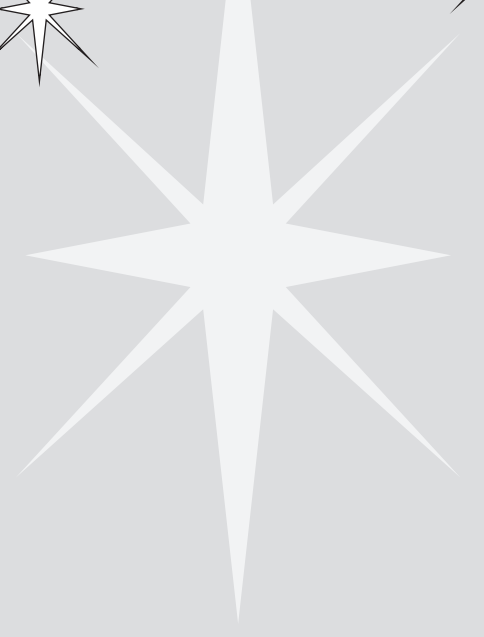

## Online Research

**Jump into Research** (grades 3–12): We'll craft a customized tour of the library's online resources that will help your students succeed with their research. *20-minute minimum.*

**Introduction to Search Engines and How to Evaluate Websites** (grades 6–12): A review of basic web searching and site evaluation skills, with a focus on the sites found on the library's Homework Center. *40-minute minimum.*

**Live Homework Help** (grades 4–12): Connect students one-on-one to qualified online tutors. *15-minute minimum.*

**Think Before You Click** (grades 4–12): This Internet safety and etiquette presentation covers topics such as online privacy, advertising, spam, viruses, false information and appropriate online behavior. *45-minute minimum.*

**Picture This** (grades 6–12): Students need images for papers and presentations. Learn to effectively use search engines, databases and websites to find copyright-free images and clip art books. This talk also introduces Central Library's Picture File Collection (recommended for field trips to Central Library) and basic information on copyright. *30-minute minimum.*



An Internet connection is required for all Online Research presentations.

Students should know their Multnomah County Library card number and PIN.

These presentations work best in a computer lab setting.

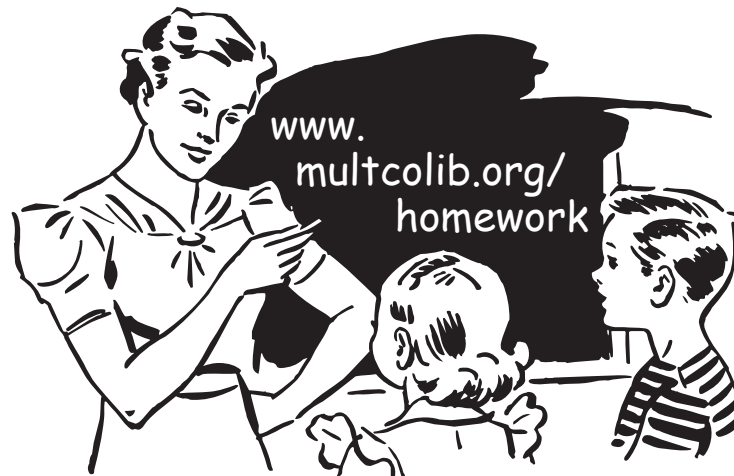
## Books, Booklists and Websites

**Bucket of Books** (grades K–12): These tubs contain 24–30 books on a topic, plus a teacher's guide. Visit the Bucket of Books website ([www.multcolib.org/schoolcorps/bucket.html](http://www.multcolib.org/schoolcorps/bucket.html)) for a current list of topics and instructions on how to request a bucket.

**Booklists** (grades K–12): If we don't have a Bucket of Books on your topic, check our booklist website ([www.multcolib.org/schoolcorps/booklists.html](http://www.multcolib.org/schoolcorps/booklists.html)), which has copies of our most popular booklists and instructions on how to create your own Bucket of Books using the lists.

**Customized Book Collection** (grades K–12): If we don't have a Bucket of Books or booklist on your topic, we can create a customized booklist for your students and send one copy of each book on the list to a nearby library for you to check out. Make your request at [www.multcolib.org/schoolcorps/assign.html](http://www.multcolib.org/schoolcorps/assign.html). *Requires a three-week lead time.*

**Customized Webliography** (grades K–12): Let us create an annotated list of websites on a subject for your students.



## Books, Literacy and Your Public Library

**Feasting on Forbidden Fruit** (grades 4–7 and 8–12): How does censorship affect children and teens? Includes an overview of censorship issues, a PowerPoint presentation on challenged books, and a chance for students to review banned and challenged picture books. *One-hour minimum.*

**Booktalks** (all ages): Encourage your students to read! We can present booktalks (brief commercials) for the latest titles, current award winners, specific genres, multicultural topics or other subjects you request.

**Zine-Making** (grades 6–12): Bring zines into your classroom! Librarians cover a quick history of zines (self-published magazines) and share zine-making techniques — then students go to work writing, cutting and pasting up their zine. We provide supplies. *Please book at least two weeks in advance and plan for a one-hour minimum workshop. This program is offered on a limited basis, subject to staff availability.*
